JACK GULVIN: Recycler Extraordinaire


You may know Jack Gulvin for his work with the BTG: leading our Tree Walks and Purple Martin Chats, tending to the Martins, and everything else he's done over his 24 seasons as a BTG guide. But he loves more than plants and birds ... he loves recycling too.

Jack has been recycling containers he finds on Chautauqua grounds and throughout the county for probably 25+ years. He picked up the habit after spending so much time in natural areas plagued by cans and now recycles many thousands of cans each year. The Chautauqua Daily wrote that "eccentric hobbies such as recycling are part of what allows him to spend so much time caring for Chautauqua's purple martins." Not only that, but Jack helps to keep the forests and parks in Chautauqua County clear of litter. Jack truly is vital to the Chautauqua ecosystem in more ways than one!

Jack also has used some of his funds from can collecting to donate to organizations like the Purple Martin Conservation Association.
